With the closing of Guyana International Bible Institute, Operation Guyana is making plans to assume the role of training church leaders.

“What an amazing God we serve!” Steve DeLoach, Operation Guyana director, exclaimed. “He is busy this year giving us tremendous opportunities for the work in Guyana.”

While busy trying to nail down a location for the school, Steve said existing church facilities could probably be used for training. Also existing personnel could be used to teach, and some of the visiting missions teams could also be used for instruction.

“This just happened and we are busy trying to work out the details,” Steve continued, “so everything is not nailed down yet. We are just in awe of the opportunity for service this will bring.”

Operation Guyana has had a nurturing institute for some time, and that will probably serve as a beginning point for the new school. Day and night classes may be offered, as well as progress-at-your-own pace classes.

“We hope to be flexible in training these people, to fit their work schedule,” Steve added.

“The really exciting part of this is that these graduates will receive a degree from Sunset International Bible Institute of Lubbock. We have already been approved as an applicant school and look forward to a closer relationship.”
