The area of Guyana recently lost their ambulance service and the people have been without one.

"The ambulance is in Tennessee right now being signed for the ambulance service," Steve DeLoach, executive director of Operation Guyana, said.

"It will read donated by Dyersburg Regional Medical Center and Operation Guyana. This is a major blessing for the people of Guyana.

"They have been without ambulance service for some time now and the need there is very great."

The hospital delivered the ambulance and all the ownership documents to DeLoach last month.

"We certainly would like to thank the hospital and its officials for this tremendous gift to the people of Guyana," DeLoach explained.

"Because of their economic situation there, it would have been difficult for the Guyanese to raise the funds for a piece of equipment like this. This will improve medical care dramatically."

After the signing is done, it will be shipped to Guyana.
